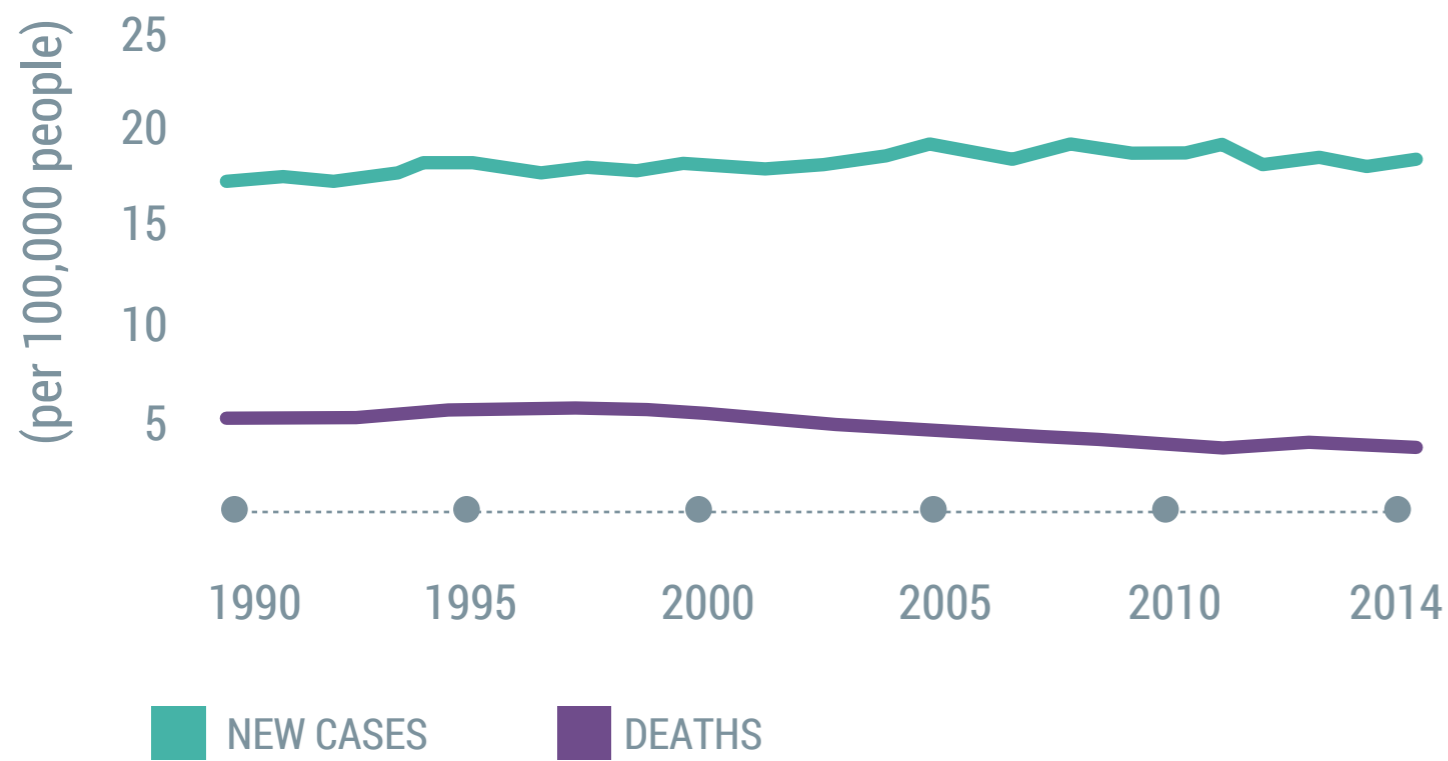


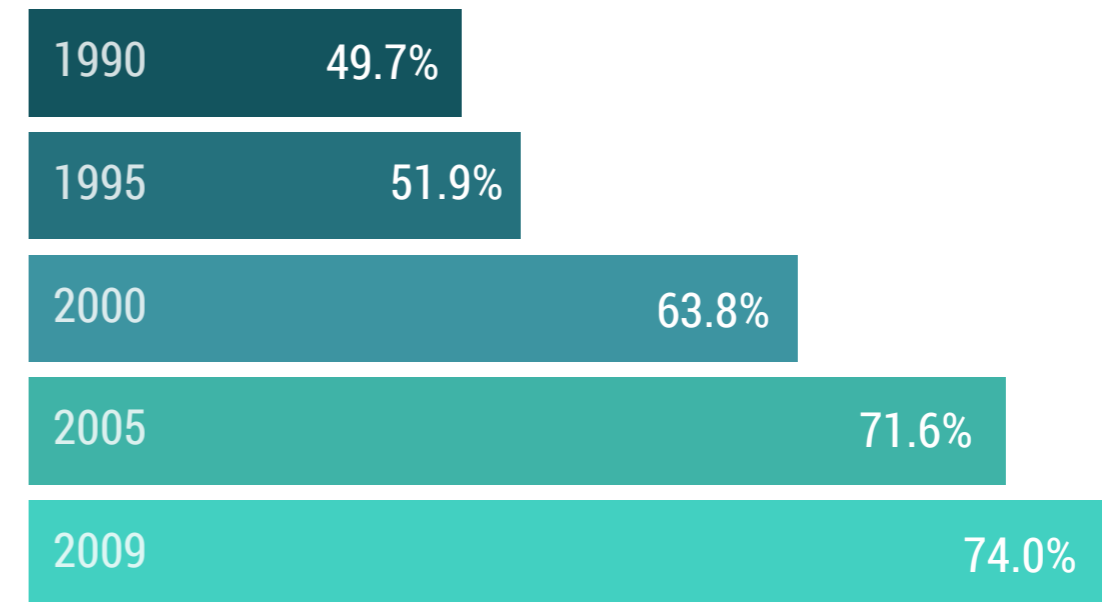
Non-Hodgkin Lymphoma

Non-Hodgkin Lymphoma and Overall Cancer Incidence

Non-Hodgkin lymphoma has the seventh highest incidence rate of all adult cancers.

Non-Hodgkin lymphoma represents 4.3% of all new cancer cases in the United States.
